Synod – Introduction

On 10 October 2021, Pope Francis formally opened a worldwide two year process officially called 'Synod 2021 – 2023: For a Synodal Church'. A Synod means a Council of the Church, and comes from the Greek word meaning *a shared journey*. Synods usually involve the Bishops of the Church coming together to discern matters of doctrine or faith. Pope Francis has called for this Synod to be much wider in its consultation, so that the voices of all who follow Jesus, within the worldwide Catholic Church, can be heard. We are asked by Pope Francis to reflect on three areas;

Communion

Participation

Mission

Within our Archdiocese, each parish has been asked by Archbishop Leo Cushley to gather the views of all parishioners on these three topics.

In our parish, Father Tony has begun that process by providing more information on the Synod, including a letter from the Archbishop. Further information is available in the weekly bulletin and on our website www.stjohnogilvies.co.uk

Reflection and Feedback

We are now asked to reflect on the three areas of Communion, Participation and Mission in the context of being followers of Jesus within the parish, and in relation to the wider Catholic Church. The attached questions are designed to guide us in our reflection, and there is also a prayer to help us. There may be other issues or themes that seem important to you. If so, please include them in your feedback.

How can we support engaged and married couples to renew and build their marriages on Jesus Christ?

How can we support and encourage vocations to the priesthood and religious life?

Theme 2; **Mission**

Do I believe that God has called me to follow him as a disciple? If so, have I responded to this call? What is the work of a missionary disciple?

How have I been prepared to live my life at home, in my place of work or study, and in my social life?

Am I comfortable talking about Jesus to others? If not, what would help me be more confident in doing this?

What can my parish do in preparing me, and others, to be a committed disciple of Jesus?

What does my parish need in order to become an evangelising community?

How can I respond to those needs? What can I realistically give?

How can our parish be a light for our local community, to share with others the love of Jesus and his saving truth?
